New Biography of Carl Zeiss Available in Stores

Book sheds new light on the company founder in celebration of his 200th birthday.

This year the company ZEISS is commemorating the 200th birthday of the company founder with many different activities and events. This week the German edition of *Carl Zeiss: A Biography 1816-1888* will be published by the Böglau Verlag. It was written by historian Stephan Paetrow and the Head of the ZEISS Archives, Dr. Wolfgang Wimmer. The 144-page book brings the figure of Carl Zeiss to life and is available at bookstores for €19.90. The English edition will be available in June.

The biography contains around 100 images, and the reader can learn more about the precision mechanic who set about revolutionizing optical device construction from his workshop in the German town of Jena. "The number of written documents left to us by Carl Zeiss is surprisingly small," says Dr. Wolfgang Wimmer. "Since not much is known about the life of Carl Zeiss, we've made the most of the enigmatic sources we have." When conducting their research, the two authors examined a ledger which Zeiss kept between 1848 and 1863. In this ledger, Zeiss recorded the income and expenses of his young company. The authors also examined the microscope ledgers, which contain detailed documentation on which microscopes were produced and to whom they were delivered. "The biography has a strong historical foundation but is written in a style that is easy to read," says Wimmer, describing the book.

"Sometimes intensive research is also necessary to prove that something did not happen," adds Wimmer, Head of the ZEISS Archives. "For example: it's a legend that Zeiss applied to settle in Weimar and the local authorities rejected his application, prompting Zeiss to open his workshop in Jena. There was no information to substantiate this claim in any archive."

This biography also brings the person and history of Carl Zeiss into the present through conversations with today's descendants, company representatives and scientists.

On 15 June at 8:15 p.m., a reading took place at the Jena University Thalia bookstore on Leutragraben 1 in Jena. At this event, the two authors presented the book and the results of their research into the life of Carl Zeiss.
